### *“The Law of Liberty”*

Text: James 2:10-13

#### I. THE OF THE LAW OF LIBERTY (vs.10-11)

- The person who breaks *one* law has been brought under the condemning \_\_\_\_\_ of the *whole* law!
- This is a powerful denunciation of “ \_\_\_\_\_ obedience.
- It will become God’s liberating truth for us when we decide to *respect, apply, and obey* \_\_\_\_\_ He says!
- “Moral freedom” is not “*the right to do what you want to do*” It is “*the power to do what you \_\_\_\_\_ to do.*”

#### II. THE OF THE LAW OF LIBERTY( vs.12-13)

- James 2:12 is a reference to “The Judgment \_\_\_\_\_ of Christ.” (I Cor. 3:11-15 and II Cor. 5:9-11)
- The *merciless* individual, who gives people what they \_\_\_\_\_ instead of what they *need*, has never truly experienced the deep mercy of God.
- A powerful illustration of the utter depravity of the human heart—we demand to \_\_\_\_\_ something we are unwilling to *give*!
- We can experience as much \_\_\_\_\_ as we are willing to *surrender* to Christ.
